Sitting down with the very laid back Mason

Rack Band at the Beach House Hotel a few weeks ago it was hard not to be swept away by the pure energy and charisma oozing from these three lads, the energy crackles and the vibe is thrilling. The band consists of Jules Keshan on Drums, , Jamie Roberts on Bass, and of course Mason Rack on lead vocals, guitar and percussion. Playing blues and rock is what this threesome have become masters at.

From the first strum of the guitar, to the beat of the drums and the deep chords of the bass guitar you just can't get enough. Midway through one song the band members actually change instruments and show how versatile they truly are. The beer keg drum is definitely a feature used later in the show in a jaw dropping, tension filled segment that shows all three band members beating the drums in unison as the tempo increases followed by some pretty impressive stick throwing.

Mason Rack grew up playing percussion from the age of six. His father Billy was a very talented Jazz musician and surfer. Mason was born in Southport, Queensland. His mother who he lived with growing up would listen to a lot of music that would become influences throughout his life.

Who is the songwriter in the group, and where do you get your inspiration from?

We all are but I, (Mason) do a lot of it. Our inspiration comes from everything, everyday life, trials and tribulations, successes and failures.

ur names are Marj Speedy and Gina Woodman, we were inspired after going to the Beach for a Path of Grace, Labyrinth. After attending and going to the beach that day and walking the sacred journey which is about change, growth, and Movement, transformation, continuously expanding your vision of what is possible, while stretching your soul, learning to see clearly and deeply, and taking courageous challenges at every step along the way.

We decided that we would start the wonderful venture of walking. So on the 20th October 2016, we started our journey of walking with just the two of us, we thought that early morning at 5.30am was a good time to start as it was refreshing, relaxing and beautiful at this time of morning.

We posted our photo on Face book, after doing this we had a number of requests from other women to ask if they could join us, we openly said yes. We currently have 80 members from around Australia on our Face book group page which is called the healthy Butterfly Sisters. Since beginning we have had up to 21 women walking with a minimum of between 10-18 walking.

Our Name the Butterfly sisters came from one of our deadly walkers Lenore, when we had the influx of butterflies on the Fraser coast on one of walks we were discussing name and as we were surrounded by beautiful butterfly's we decided that as we were also spreading our wings the connection

was perfect to call ourselves the Healthy Butterfly Sisters.

This group is open to all women 18 and upwards. Our youngest is 24 years and our oldest is 70 years of age. This time is for women supporting each other, being healthy and active while closing the gap for our Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander and South Sea women, we encourage all women

We walk 3 days a week Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 5.30am to 6.30pm. On Monday we meet at Reef World car park, Dayman Park, Urangan. Every Wednesday we meet at the car park near Aqua View, Torquay and Every Friday we meet at Enzos, Scarness.

Our walks have helped build our self-esteem and we are able to support and encourage each other with everyday life

During our walks we dress up in themes eg. R&B Friday, Christmas, footy, cancer, St Patricks Day, Valentines, closing the gap, Survival Day and of course the deadly birthdays. We also pay our respects when a community member or family member has passed away, we do this by having a minute silence and a release of flowers into the ocean. 



ARCANE ECHO is a Brisbane based Electronic Bass DJ that burst onto the music scene in 2014. He has been on tour to various festivals and locations from places like Pacha Sydney, Brisbane's Shrine Family, Academy Perth,

Defqon 1 Festival, over at the Wall in New Zealand. A few weeks ago he played at the Criterion Hotel in Maryborough much to the delight of the crowd. On the web page it is said that he 'Delivers blistering bass music brimming with hints of metal and hardcore tips via a solid tap of the Launch Pad'.

Arcane Echo, who's real name is Josh, has always been musically inclined. From about six years of age his mother put him in front of the piano and he began piano lessons. Throughout his school life he also played drums, guitar, double bass, and Violin. He also spent four years in the Brisbane Conservatorium so you could definitely say that he has had classical and multi-Instrumental training.

One of the many things that makes Arcane Echo unique as opposed to other DJ's is that his music features a Launchpad and a Maschine, as he produces music himself he wanted to expand the drum element of the music. This turned into creating videos online. From there he just started doing drumbeats and working on developing new sounds, these turned into complete songs, bass lines and melodies. For those that do not know

what a Maschine and a Launchpad are they are basically drum samplers. They both allow you to play allocated sound in real time. The Launchpad just has more buttons. As for vocals, the majority of the vocals are done by other Artists, he considers himself more as a producer than a vocalist.

Arcane Echo is heavily influenced by cinema and film and likes to inject emotion and energy within the heavy music genre that he works in. Growing up he was the Emo kid always at the back of the class, this he has translated into his

electronic projects.


The name Arcane Echo basically came from Google as he wanted his DJ persona to mean something that sounded mysterious. So Arcane Echo translates into Mysterious Noise.

One of the first things that you notice about the man himself is that he is literally covered in tattoos. Even though Josh says that appearance doesn't matter he has experienced first-hand peoples various reaction's to his look.

Josh likes the art of tattooing as he gets to design all of them himself and enjoys being able to express his own design and personality.

Celebrating Vicki Neville's 20th Season with the Whales

Vicki first came to my attention quite a few years ago at a Paddle Out For The Whales Ceremony in Hervey Bay, this event was all about celebrating the whale season and encouraging whale conservation. On this day Vicki was talking about the whales to a crowd of people, and I remember looking at this blond passionate girl with the most animated eyes, engaging personality and the biggest smile, that I have followed her ever since. Vicki's whale photography is amazing, and through her I have watched each whale season unfold. Recently through social media I have watched Vicki battle with Breast Cancer and all of the procedures endured. This was followed by the horrific injury to her eye. Vicki is mum to two children, daughter Kiarni, 10 and Rory, 11, and has a husband named Stuart. Daughter Kiarni said that, "Her mum is so special, and has a great love for marine life. She is also always positive and happy".

This is Vicki's story - Kim Parnell - Editor

It took me about three years to fall pregnant with my son Rory. I was an older mum about 35 at the time and I have to say that it changed my life. Before kids I had gone out to pubs, socialised, and partied. After having Rory It was great to have somebody else to look after to love and cherish, then a year and a half later Kiarni came along,

I don't think that I have loved anybody so much as my children and my husband.

My son Rory overcame a massive brain bleed when he was eight years old. We are so lucky as he had a miracle recovery after rehabilitation. That was the worst thing that I have ever had to deal with regarding the children. To think that I could have lost my son was the most devastating thing in my life.

I was diagnosed with Breast Cancer in 2016, and in the same year had a bad eye injury from some broken glass while loading bottles onto the whale boat, Tasmin Venture.

After Rory's episode I guess it was a bit of a cruel episode to go through something else so major not even three years later. I am a pretty strong person so the initial diagnosis was, ok so lets get on and do this. But at the time I didn't know where I was heading as there was so many appointments and people to see. I did break down a couple of weeks later for a couple of days when the scary thoughts came in as to what was going to happen, and about the kids. I realised that this is heavy, but I had to deal with it and soldier on.

Then my eye accident happened which in one way was worse than the cancer stuff because with the cancer stuff I was doing Chemotherapy but I was lucky enough not to get any side effects. Everyday life was pretty normal for me, I was still doing all of the things that I did before.

Three days before I was due to start work with the whales I had my eye accident. I was still on Chemo and I found myself back in



hospital again. So there was I sitting in a hospital in Brisbane, not out there with my whales. Then I got told how serious my eye was, I could have lost my eyesight for good because at that stage it was touch and go. I was in the Brisbane hospital for five days not knowing what was going to happen.

So with the cancer I was living life pretty normal between many appointments. When I had my eye injury everything stopped, I couldn't drive, couldn't go to work, I couldn't take the kids anywhere as I could not drive for seven weeks, so things changed hugely for me.

I have finished all of my radiation and chemotherapy now. At the moment I am doing the natural thing in preventing the Cancer from coming back so I am living a healthy lifestyle eating alternate food and concoctions to try to keep my estrogen levels down as it was a hormone positive cancer. I am seeing great results in keeping the levels down, and have regular testing for this. If I find that what I am doing is ineffective then I will re-evaluate. I also have regular mammograms.

My family were very supportive during my diagnosis. We are a very strong family now because of all the things that we have been through. My kids are very resilient and grounded.

This year I celebrate 20 whale seasons as a Tour Guide and a deckhand on the Tasman Venture.

The save the whale campaign trail has got stronger and stronger for me over the years, I even assist in some research from time to time. Then of course in 2015 the Documentary, The Whale Whisperer produced by Greg Grainger was made. of which I, at the time unwittingly became the star of. We filmed for nine days In a little boat so we would zoom around trying to find pods. It was great getting the spotlight on Hervey Bay Whales and for me the big thing was that the focus was a lot on the conservation side.

This year I just want to get back to work and get my eye sorted. Unfortunately there will be permanent damage. Sunlight is a major issue as my life and my work is out in the sun. But I am going to have to deal with that at some stage. I will have to put this injury aside



when we get to the end of it medically. My bosses have been unbelievably supportive throughout my Journey.

I have to get back on the boat to be with the whales so I am going to be very strong and move forward with the injury as I do in life.

My advice to mums out there is don't sweat the small stuff, spend quality time with your children because accidents happen you just don't know what's around the corner. I am trying to instill in my kids what I have learnt over the years about being resilient, good mannered living life to the fullest, and chasing your dreams.



However with the recent heavy rain the Fraser Coast has had. there will be plenty of prawns flushed from the rivers and creeks; this is prime time to catch whiting on lures, particularly when they are feeding on prawns up on the surface of the water

There are plenty of advantages when using lures:

- Instead of anchoring a bait in the place, lures will cover a much larger area, therefore attracting more fish and getting more bites.
- On average the larger, better quality fish tend to be caught
- It's great fun actually seeing the fish strike the lure on the surface of the water
- It's actually much simpler and easier to go down to your favourite whiting spot with a lure instead of having to cart buckets, yabbie pumps etc.

So next time you trek off to your favourite whiting flat, try taking a few small poppers and stick baits. The local tackle shop will point you in the right direction when it comes to choosing lures.

Summer Whiting can be caught all year around, but the summer months are best. If there has been heavy rain, they'll be chasing prawns and is a good time to target them.



afood Paella

A fresh Fraser Coast seafood paella is the perfect dish to enjoy with family & friends.

The paella rice should be soft and luscious with the grains separated and unbroken, with a crunchy caramelised layer on the base of the pan (the best part!). A standard size paella pan fits nicely into a Weber Family Q or kettle BBQ, and the cooking aromas will make the neighbours hungry too!





INGREDIENTS

10 large Fraser Coast green prawns, left whole.

500 g Fraser Coast green prawn meat.

500g Hervey Bay scallop meat.

500g green-lipped mussels, shells scrubbed and cleaned.

200g calamari rings.

250g salmon fillet, cubed.

1 tablespoon olive oil. 1 onion finely chopped.

2 tomatoes, chopped. 4 cloves garlic, crushed.

2 teaspoons smoked paprika. 1 pinch saffron threads

4 ½ cups seafood stock (made from the prawn heads and shells)

2 cups paella rice

1 cup baby peas

1 cup sweet corn kernels Sea salt & cracked black pepper 2 cups parsley leaves 1 lemon cut into wedges

METHOD

Add the paprika & saffron to the stock in a saucepan, stir, bring to the boil & simmer.

Heat oil in a paella pan or large frying pan over a high heat.

Add the onion & garlic & cook until lightly golden. Add the rice & tomatoes & fry for a few minutes, while stirring.

Continue frying on low heat, adding the stock a cup at a time, stirring gently as it is absorbed into the rice mixture.

After 10 minutes, add the peeled prawn meat, whole prawns, scallops, calamari, mussels and fish and stir through once.

Leave to simmer without stirring for 5 more minutes, until the rice is cooked. Add more stock as necessary.

Garnish with lemon wedges and parsley, season with salt and pepper and serve.
