

BY THE C Artist Spotlight JAMES REYNE



James Reyne is without a doubt one of this countries best known aussie rockstar's. With Iconic songs from the Australian Crawl Days like, The Boys Light Up, Beautiful People and Reckless under his belt, He has also had a very successful solo career spanning decades and had many hits. I caught up with James via phone to have a conversation about his upcoming performance at Seafront Oval as one of the headline acts for, 'By the C'.

James, on doing my research for this interview I came across the trailer for Return to Eden set in the 80's. This was, and still remains one of my favourite series ever. What was it like to play Greg Marsden all that time ago?

Wow, that was such a long time ago. It was certainly a lot of fun, and I thoroughly enjoyed myself. A lot of people today tell me how much they loved the series. I was very lucky to make some firm fast friends during my time on the show.

On Acting and performing as a Musician?

I love acting but realised early on that you need to commit to one thing at a time. Being an Actor in Australia is a tough act, you have to work very hard. I have felt privileged at times to be able to dabble in both.

You spent seven years with Australian Crawl, what was that time like?

Again it was such a long time ago. It was like another person did it. We were young and we enjoyed ourselves. I have done so much since those days.

James, I have also read that you have had twelve top forty solo hits, what a great achievement. What do you regard as the secret of longevity?

You just have to keep on doing it. Stay the course and practise your craft. You will have many ups and downs, but you need to ride them and just carry on doing it. Right now I believe that we are doing better than we ever have, we are in a good place.

In 1988 you toured with Tina Turner, what was that experience like, especially a few years later playing Tina Turner's manager in the movie What's Love Got

Tina is a lovely person. Actually Tina Turner's manager, Roger Davies managed me as well during the late eighties. I have made over a dozen solo albums.

In 2014 you were recognised with a Medal of the Order of Australia "for service to the performing arts as a singer/songwriter, and through your support of various charities". What was it like to be recognised?

I would be lying if I said that I wasn't chuffed. I certainly didn^Tt expect it. I had to keep it secret for two or three months before I could tell anybody. I was very pleased and thank them very much.

What is it like to work with Acts like, The Black Sorrows, John Farnham and Ross Wilson?

It is great. I have known them all for a very long time. They are all extremely professional and honestly their records speak for themselves, it truly is a great line-up.

Have you been to the Fraser Coast before?

I have been to the Fraser Coast before but just don't ask me when. It was a long time ago I think. The Fraser Coast is always beautiful.

Do you have a special message for the people of the Fraser Coast before the upcoming concert?

We look forward to seeing you all. You will probably know all of the songs, it will be a great environment, and a fantastic family day out with a comprehensive line-up of well known artists.

A Laid-back Low'n'Slow

Christmas.

Christmas is fast approaching, and it's time to start thinking about how to cater for your special family celebration, Fraser Coast-style. Our Christmas family get-togethers tend to be a little crazy.

It's a day where everyone can relax, go to the beach for a swim, break out the backyard cricket gear, and maybe catch a fish or two...before gathering around the dining table for a special feast. Every year we have a different theme for our Christmas celebrations, which extends to the menu, beverages and silly costumes, like last year's "Tropical Island Christmas" theme.

Because our Christmas weather is usually warm and humid, it makes sense to consider options like serving our fabulous Hervey Bay seafood chilled, and to do any other cooking outside on the barbecue if possible. With the recent surge in popularity of low'n'slow barbecue, that will be our theme this year...a laid-back low'n'slow luncheon cooked in the backyard BBQ den, served sliced and diced on huge platters.

I was lucky enough to find a couple of 1.2 metre long food grade-treated wood panels at Bunnings recently (for just \$20 each) which when covered with banana leaves and topped with fresh seafood, low'n'slow barbecue, salads and sides, will make an awesome Christmas dinner presentation stretching the full length of our outdoor dining table.

With a low'n'slow bullet smoker, an ancient weber kettle and a gas barbecue in our outdoor kitchen, all that is required is a little pre-planning to ensure that all items on the menu are ready around the same time.

For low'n'slow barbecue, meats are generally seasoned with a "rub" mix of spices and herbs the day before, and left to absorb those flavours overnight before going into the barbecue at low heat early enough to be ready for the banquet. Low'n'slow barbecue cooking is generally discussed in degrees Fahrenheit, and usually around 225f is the typical temperature to aim for and keep your barbecue steady at throughout the cook. You can also add chunks or chips of fruit woods like cherry and apple to develop those subtle barbecue flavours.

Our low'n'slow BBQ themed Christmas menu this year will include Hervey Bay scallops, a whole fish wrapped in banana leaves, a home-cured and smoked ham, home-brined and smoked turkey breast, barbecued beef short ribs and chicken wings. Prep times will vary per item...the pork will need to go into the cure two weeks earlier, the turkey 2 days before, and the beef ribs and chicken wings will be rubbed with Eat at Dan & Steph's awesome BBQ competition rub the night before.

Then it's just a matter of an early rise on Christmas day for the BBQ cook to fire up the charcoal or heat beads and get the BBQ temperatures nice and steady at 225f, then putting each item into the barbecue in accordance with estimated cooking times. Just after Santa leaves the house in the wee hours is a good time to start.

Approximate cooking times at 225f:

Scallops - 20 mins

Whole fish – about 1.5 hours...until the fish flakes apart easily

Boneless pork leg or shoulder for home-made ham – about 5 hours... until internal temperature reaches 160f

Turkey breast meat – about 1.5 hours...until internal temperature reaches

Chicken wings – about 1.5 hours...until internal temperature reaches 170f **Beef short ribs** – about 8 hours...until internal temperature reaches 203f A nice glaze on each for presentation and a little time to rest and become pull-apart tender will complete a Christmas dinner to delight all present

pull-apart tender will complete a Christmas dinner to delight all present. Your seafood and meats will be unbelievably juicy and tender and absolutely full of flavour.

And then there's the snacks, entrees, desserts, beverages, etc...but that's another story.





ART DESIGN ARCHITECTURE

In Australia steel has played an essential part in the development of our design vernacular. In the hands of skilled Australian designers and makers steel has become an essential material that helps to articulate a national character and contributes to our distinctive material culture.

For the many thousands of varieties of steel there is one that seems intrinsically linked with the Australian identity, the corrugated steel sheets known as corrugated Iron. Synonymous with Australia's rural and mining landscapes, whilst also forming an essential part of the classic "Aussie" back yard corrugated iron is durable, strong, adaptable and light.

The Drew House, 2010 by Simon Laws takes its cues from the architecture of Queensland's cane growing region around Bundaberg. The dramatic visual language of the sugar cane mill its large scale boilers and turbines juxtaposed with the beautiful silhouetted forms of the corrugated iron water tanks and stands, find form in this holiday home. Built to be a luxury form of camping, the house operates as a piece of sculpture on a bushland site camped at by the Drew siblings for many years.







Established in 2007, Design by Them is a Sydney based design-company representing and producing the works of Australian designers. Founded by Industrial designers Sarah Gibson and Nick Karlovasitis, Design by Them creates a playful collection of fun and functional furniture and lighting. Made of mirror polished stainless steel, The Corro Bowl, 2009 is a beautifully refined corrugated form accentuating steel's inherent strength and fluidity.

Lorraine Connelly-Northey is a Waradgerie woman from Swan Hill in north-west Victoria. The strong cultural practice of weaving is translated in her work transforming found materials particularly agricultural detritus into traditional forms such as koolimans (coolamons) and narrbongs (dilly bags). Her choice of material from Australia's frontier and colonial history reminds us of Australia's fraught history with its first nation's peoples.

Australia like most countries has many cultural tropes and myths surrounding its identity. Apart from the traditions of our first nations' people, Australian identities have been forged through many lenses including our convict past and colonial frontiers with its bush ranger legends, the Anzac traditions of courage and sacrifice, to one of the most mythologised 'Aussies' that of the counter culture surfer history of the 1960s and 70s. Trent Jansen looks to these myths to create designs through a process he describes as design anthropology, his Tidal collection, 2015 for Tait conjures long laid-backed summers spent relaxing at the beach or by the pool.

Steel is the most recycled material on the planet, more than all other materials combined. The amazing metallurgical properties of steel, allows it to be recycled continually with no degradation in performance, from one product to another. The recycling of steel can be seen in the beautifully crafted knives of master knife maker Barry Gardner. Working mainly with Damascus steel, Gardner tiers up layers of molten steel sourced from old files and band saw blades which he then reworks, twisting and folding to create the distinctive and unique patterns. From an ancient craft, to one that works with modern technology to realise its final result, Maureen Faye Chauhan's intricate mild steel brooches are realised through the manipulation of 3D images in advanced computer aided design programs and laser printing. Working with fundamental geometric patterns found in nature's building blocks, Chauhan relies on repeated elements and the strength of steel to create her complex forms.

These are just a mere snap shot of 29 contemporary Australian exhibitors in STEEL art design architecture. Get your coins ready for 'The Annual Ambulance Goods Wheel'.




The Hervey Bay Local Ambulance Committee's Annual Ambulance Goods Wheel has been held at Christmas time on the Scarness foreshore for more than 65 years. The Goods Wheel was originally run by the Scarness Progress Association in the 1940's, to raise funds for foreshore improvements as it was a popular holiday destination and event back then. (This original Goods Wheel is now housed at the Hervey Bay Museum).

In 1948 the need for an Ambulance service was put forward and a committee was formed to raise funds to build an ambulance station. To start with, the ambulance committee could hold a goods wheel anywhere in the Bay except for Scarness. Eventually the Progress Association invited the local ambulance committee to become involved on a 50/50 basis. After some time the Goods Wheel operation was given to the Local Ambulance Committee to organise and they have continued to do so till this very day.

This year, the Ambulance Goods Wheel will start spinning on Saturday evening on the 16th of December and will run nightly, from 7pm, for 3 weeks until Saturday 6th January, (except Christmas Day). Tickets are only 50 cents each and the lucky winning ticket holders get to choose their own prize from the huge range on display. Prizes include: toys, manchester, household items, camping, gardening and auto tools, small electrical appliances and so much more. All losing tickets go in the barrel for a chance to win a 4 burner gas BBQ, to be drawn on the last night.

The Goods Wheel would not run without the valuable assistance from different Service Clubs and groups who come down each night and volunteer their time to sell tickets. 

There's no doubt Australian Bass are great fun to catch on light Sportfishing gear. They are aggressive, hard pulling little fish than can be caught on a variety of lures and flies resembling the food they prey upon.

Lures and flies that imitate frogs and cicadas kicking on the surface, or subsurface baitfish and shrimp patterns will all get a bight from Aussie Bass. A light spin outfit in the 4-6 kg range,or fly rod loaded with a 7 weight line will give you lots of fun chasing these feisty sportfish.

Although a small boat, kayak, canoe or float tube will give anglers more options for finding bass, using Google Earth will help you find land based or wading locations for the more adventurous anglers.

The summer months are a good time of year for chasing bass, so now is the time to get out there and give it a go.

STEP BACK IN TIME WITH A MARYBOROUGH CEMETERY TOUR

In 1998, students at St Helen's State School embarked on a project to discover more information about the early history of the school focussing on the military service of the first headmaster, and students who had fought in the various wars.

As part of this learning experience, the students visited the Cemetery and the graves of the men they were researching. They were assisted in their research and Cemetery visits by Margaret Wroe and Kaye O'Brien. Afternoon tours for members of the public followed. Volunteers from the Maryborough and District Family History Society then began the night tours.

The tours include an overview of the history of our Cemeteries and Mortuary Chapel, and stories on the many personalities that now lay at rest. The stories change each month and include fabulous insights into the history of our region, including the tragic

tales of murders, drownings and poisonings, war heroes, city benefactors, the first burial and our links to Florence Nightingale, Buffalo Bill, Ned Kelly etc.



In the Kitchen with Kerri Oakhill

Owner of - A Spoon full of Sugar Café - Maryborough



How long have you owned A Spoon full of Sugar Café, what made you get into the Industry?

We have owned A Spoon full of Sugar Café for nearly three years. We have a passion for fresh food and coffee and have always enjoyed cooking for friends and family we have always wanted to open a family friendly alfresco style café.

Your Café is obviously named after a famous song from Mary Poppins, who came up with the name?

I came up with the name. At the time we were right beside the Mary Poppins statue and had just purchased the café. A change of name was definitely needed once we saw how popular Mary Poppins was with the tourists, and what better name for a café than A Spoon full of Sugar.

What advice would you give someone who was looking at getting into the café industry?

Make sure you are passionate and love what you do. There have been some hard times recently and unless you are committed it would be easier to walk away. I have learnt a lot about people over the last six months and finally, 'Know your customer'.

How would you sum up your menu?

Fresh tasty food served in a casual atmosphere. We make everything from fresh locally supplied ingredients. A bit of a modern and old fashioned mix.

What is the most popular dish on the 'A Spoon full of Sugar Cafe' menu?

Lunch/ All Day - Avocado and tomato Bruschetta.

Do you use many local suppliers, if so who?

Yes, we use - Hervey Bay Coffee, HBW, Fraser Coast Food Services, Beemart, Dairy Farmers, distributors Larry and Liz Blake.

What do you most like to cook when at home?

There is no one thing we like to cook. We love to cook outdoors on the weber kettle, BBQ or fire. Slow cooked meats and roasts on the weber including baked ham are delicious. Fresh fish wrapped in banana leaves or lamb shanks in the camp oven cooked in a fire pit is a favourite to. Or there is nothing better than a good old fashioned bbq with steak, fresh salads and a warm potato salad.

How long have you lived on the Fraser Coast, and what is your favourite thing to do?

We moved to the Fraser Coast in 2004 after holidaying on Fraser Island. We loved the area and wanted to move closer. We may live and work in Maryborough but absolutely love the beach we get away for quick trips to Hervey Bay when we can, or go off for a few days camping at Inskip.



When my kids were younger I used to love cooking with them in the kitchen, I used to especially enjoy making these simple Biscuit Recipes. I don't miss the cleaning up though. This is a great school holiday activity that the whole family can enjoy.

Jam Drops

Ingredients:

6 tbsp butter

1/2 cup sugar

1 egg

1/2 tsp vanilla essence

1 3/4 cups sifted self raising flour

A pinch of salt

1/2 cup raspberry jam

Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan-forced). Spray two baking trays with cooking spray. Vigorously Cream the butter and sugar together till all combined.
- 2. Add egg and vanilla and beat well.
- 3. Add flour and salt and mix well.
- 4. Roll teaspoonful-sized balls of mixture and place on the baking tray with a space between each. Using your thumb make a well in the centre of each ball.

5. Fill each indentation with a teaspoon of jam. Bake for 10-15 mins

Star Cookies

Ingredients:

250g Butter

3/4 cup (165g) Castor Sugar

2 tsps Vanilla Extract

1 Egg Yolk

21/4 cups (335G) Plain, sifted Flour

1/2 cup Sanding Sugar

Method:

1. Preheat oven to 180°C (355°F). Place the butter and sugar in a mixing bowl and beat until pale and creamy. Add the vanilla and egg yolk and beat well to combine. Add the flour and beat until a the dough forms. 2. Roll out each portion of dough until 3mm thick. then use a the desired star-shaped cookie cutter to cut out 8 rounds from each sheet. Place the cookies on baking trays sprayed with cooking spray. 3. Then sprinkle with the sanding sugar and bake for 8 minutes or until the cookies are light golden. Cool on wire racks. Makes approx 32.




