The Queens Baton has been passed from hand to hand between thousands of people, throughout many countries and cultures across the world, later this month it is OUR turn.

The baton relay will come through Hervey Bay, Fraser Island and Maryborough on it's way to it's final destination the Gold Coast, in time for the start of the Commonwealth Games on April 4.

The Queens Baton started its journey on March 13, 2017 on Commonwealth day at Buckingham Palace. The Queen has placed her special message in the baton to be read out at the opening of the games.

Three of our proud Fraser Coast baton-bearers are twelve year old Jade-Elle Brown, the youngest person in Queensland to receive a national bravery award for saving her sister Molly in an horrific car accident, Multi-award winning musician and humanitarian Keri McInerney, and everyone's 'little mate', Adam Moss who was diagnosed with cerebral palsy, spastic diplegia and Ataxia at a very young age, and encourages all of us to reach our full potential.

Each baton bearer runs or walks with the baton for about 200 metres, the baton is then passed on to the next carrier.

We asked Jade-Elle, Keri and Adam a few questions before the relay began.

Jade-Elle Brown

How do you feel about being picked as a Queens Baton Relay Bearer?

I feel happy grateful and proud and very excited. I am excited to carry the baton on Sunday

March 25 in Maryborough and hope lots of people come to watch!

Are you excited/nervous about the Event?

I am excited and a little nervous because its a very rare opportunity for me to participate in.

You have been recognised for saving your sister Molly's life after a horrific car accident just over four years ago, what do remember about the accident, and how are you coping now?

I am coping better than I used to. I remember everything that occurred on that day from when we hopped in the car to when the truck crashed into us.

You received a Bravery Award for your heroic rescue, how did it feel to be recognised in this way?

It was an amazingly good surprise that had a happy impact on my life. I have met some amazing people through the Australian bravery association.

What would you like to be when you are an adult Jade-Elle?

I would like to be either an architect or a physiotherapist.

Keri McInerney

How do you feel about being picked as a Queens Baton Relay Bearer?

Being chosen as a Queens Baton Relay Bearer, makes me feel very humbled, honoured and extremely proud, to be representing my home town of Hervey Bay, Queensland and Australia in this International event. It's so wonderful to be given this accolade for my career achievements and also my community and charity work over these past years. It also makes me very proud to do this for my family who are just thrilled that this is happening. I do wish my mum was still alive to enjoy this wonderful moment with me, but

I know she will be running beside me on the day in spirit. I just feel so blessed to be a part of this amazing once in a life time experience.

Are you excited/nervous about the Event?

I'd have to say a little of both really. Excited because its going to such a unique and special experience to share with all the other Baton Bearers and the local community and nervous because its such a huge thing, and very different to being up on stage performing. We carry the Queens personal hand written message for the Commonwealth Games, that's amazing!

You have been recognised for your humanitarian work and fund-raising efforts. Tell us a little about these?

I've always believed that my career gave me an spring board to give back to others. I did this by the creation of many charity events, community projects and mentor-ship programs. It's not all about me, I've got a big heart and genuinely care about other people and what I could do to help those aspiring artists and also those less fortunate individuals who just need a helping hand

I've been involved in the organisation of many events, from two Flood Appeals one local and one state wide, with concerts being coordinated and all money raised going to assist the many people who had lost everything in the Queensland Floods. The 'Queensland Flood Appeal', gathered support state wide, with concerts in a number of regions. Everyone was so supportive and we helped a lot of people. I received a commendation from the Queensland Premier Anna Bligh for this concept. It was however just great to be able to help.

A few years later, I wrote and recorded a single for the Bali Appeal, which raised funds for victims, after the dreadful Bali attack. I was so honoured to receive commendations from the then Prime Minister Mr John Howard, The Queensland Premier, Mr Peter Beattie and the Member for Wide Bay (and former Deputy Prime Minister) Mr Warren Truss. So great to do something so worthwhile I have to say.

There have been many more projects that are memorable ones for me personally.

As a multi – award winning musician, what do you have coming up this year on the musical front?

I am currently in rehearsal with our new band line up, ready to tour my new album which is to be released very soon. I'm playing at a few festivals this year during our tour and will be performing with John Swan (Swannee) and a few other major performers in Adelaide in October, where we will be raising money for Pancreatic Cancer Research. Adam Moss

How do you feel about being picked as a Queens Baton Relay Bearer?

There are a lot of outstanding people in our community that are also worthy of this position, so I am very honoured to have been chosen out of all the people who were nominated.

Are you excited/nervous about the Event?

I am both excited and nervous at the same time. This is a once in a life time opportunity. I want my time carrying the baton to go slowly so I can enjoy the moment and remember it for ever.



You have been recognised for embracing life's challenges and inspiring others to give it a go. How do you achieve this day to day?

You only get one chance at life, so everyone should give it their all to make themselves the best person they possibly can. I like to encourage others with or without a disability to get out there and give everything a go. It doesn't matter if you win or come last, its about doing your best and accomplishing things that you never thought were possible.

What was it like to gain gold and silver medals at the National Cross Country Championships?

I never actually believed that I would become a member of the Queensland team let alone be a silver medallist, and then a gold medallist. Standing on the podium with a gold medal hanging around my neck was the proudest moment of my life. It was absolutely unbelievable, but at the same time I was tired and freezing cold and just wanted to go home for a hot bath and a lay down

- It was 5deg, raining and blowing a gale during my race.

What would you like to be when you are an adult Adam?

Obviously I would love to be an Olympian, but if not I guess I'll probably become a doctor. I love to help people and am not afraid of a little bit of blood and gore.

of K'gari and the Bay

As told by the Artist, Rolf Sieber

This exhibition showcases the beautiful, vivid and unique flora and fauna of K'gari [Fraser Island] and Hervey Bay.

The fantastic landscape is disappearing due to new developments. As an artist I would like to preserve these unique images on canvas for the generation to come in the Wide Bay Region. We are so privileged to live in close proximity to wildlife and almost untouched places like K'gari.

The exhibition takes you on a walk along the foreshores of Hervey Bay and the rainforest, the bush tracks and rugged shoreline of K'gari. these paintings also reflect the striking sunrises and sunsets, light and shades which bring dynamic into the landscape. The concept of my artworks are always innovative, and challenging I like to capture nature in a flash. That makes a painting fresh and real.

In 1999 I retired and we moved from Sydney to Hervey Bay. The beautiful beaches and the tranquil surroundings of Hervey Bay and Fraser Island inspired me to fulfil my childhood dream to became an artist. I joined the Hervey Bay Art Society to be with like minded people and learn to paint. Over the years I became an active member of the Society and at present I am the President of the Society.

I furthered my knowledge in theory and techniques at the local TAFE College and finished with a diploma of Visual Art with distinction. I have participated in art competitions throughout Queensland and won many awards, I also have had quite a number of solo exhibitions at Gatakers Artspace, Gayndah Art Gallery, Mundubbera Art Gallery and at our local Hervey Bay Regional Gallery.

One of the highlights in my painting career was a grant in 2005 from the Regional Art Development Fund to sponsor Cec Woodland and myself to develop an outdoor experience [free to air painting] on Fraser Island. Cec and myself spent days on the island tramping over sand hills and bush tracks, lugging our painting gear in backpacks, painting, sketching and photographing the islands natural charm, using the ever changing light through the forest to achieve some great and lovely results. Rather than painting the usual tourist science, we concentrated on flora and the natural beauty and wilderness of the island.

We subsequently spent nearly two months completing our artworks. At the end of the project the artworks where displayed in the foyer of the Hervey Bay Regional Gallery. The exhibition was a big success, we sold nearly all the paintings and it helped to develop a local awareness of art in Hervey Bay.

The experience and the memories of those days are still the main focus of my work. I invite the public to pause through the exhibition and take a look at the wonderful areas that surround Hervey Bay and Fraser Island, which are captured on canvas. You might stop and admire some of the paintings. Next time when you go for a walk take a look at the wonders that could easily be overlooked. I hope you enjoy the exhibition and my artworks.

Classic *Easter* Games for the whole family to enjoy

Bunnies, eggs, chicks – Easter is fast approaching. While it is important to not forget the true meaning of Easter, and the significance of the day, It is also a great time to engage with each other, to put down the mobile phone, the Ipad, the Play-station controller, and everything else that is a distraction. Why not plan one of the fun games listed below and get the whole family involved.

The Egg Knocking Game

The person that you are playing against holds up an Easter Egg and taps it against your egg. The winner is declared by the person whose egg remains whole with no cracks.

The Easter Egg Hunt

Hide enough eggs for each of the children to find. I actually used to enjoy playing hot and cold with my children, when they got close to where I knew I had hidden an egg I would say warm, then hot, then hotter until they found the egg. If they were a long way of I would say cold.

Easter egg race

This is a great game for a bigger group of kids. Just divide the group into two—man teams, each team gets two cardboard eggs, (just cut-out some ovals in cardboard). Place one egg on the ground and get one of the team-mates to stand on it. The other team-mate places the second egg in front of him and the first team-mate has to hop onto the second egg, meanwhile the first egg has been moved to the front again. You keep this up until the finish line is passed. The winner is the first team across the line.

Easter egg painting

Growing up as a child I was always fascinated with painted eggs. Every Easter our mother would boil eggs and then paint them with funny faces or landscapes etc. you never knew what you were going to get. As we got older we were able to paint our own eggs and had many a laugh. If you don't have paints use felt tip pens instead. Just make sure the outside of the egg is dry and that it has cooled slightly – Oh, and don't forget to eat the egg when you have finished painting it.

On the back of a very successful year of performances in 2017, Hervey Bay's Z-Pac theatre is looking to kick off the coming year with a bang! The first cab off the rank in Z-Pac's 2018 line-up is the immensely popular rock musical Godspell!

The musical 'Godspell' has been successfully performed all around the world - most notably were its successful runs on both West End and Broadway. It was first produced in 1971, but despite being on the cusp of 50 years old, is still exceedingly popular with audiences from all walks of life.

The story of 'Godspell' is based on the Gospel according to St Matthew. It deals with the last days of Jesus, and includes dramatised versions of several well-known parables. It should be stressed though, that this musical is so much more than your average Sunday-school lesson. Local resident of Hervey Bay and breast cancer survivor, Kat Thompson 41 has been chosen to be one of So Brave's 2018 Model Ambassadors. As part of a year long program of empowerment, each Model Ambassador will host fund-raising events and share her experience with breast cancer with the community to raise awareness that young women are also at risk and need to be breast aware. In 2018, So Brave will focus on awareness and education – presenting at schools, universities and among the medical community to share our stories and raise awareness across the community.

Each model will also participate in So Brave's Breast Cancer Fundraiser Calendar – an incredibly inspiring, colourful, empowering visual representation of the metamorphosis that each young woman has gone through. Each model is painted in full body paint and photographed for the incredibly body-positive calendar – to be launched later in 2018.

The calendar includes tips about breast care and breast health for women under 40. The calendar also shares the models and brand ambassador's stories.

The calendar aims to create awareness for breast cancer in young women and fund breast cancer research to better prevent, diagnose, monitor and treat breast cancer, especially in young women.

Founder and CEO of So Brave, and Breast Cancer Survivor, Rachelle Panitz, states:

"2018 is set to be So Brave's biggest year yet and we're finally travelling across the country to Tasmania and Western Australia. We will continue to empower young women with breast cancer. We have chosen 12 brave young women from all over Australia to participate in this year's So Brave Breast Cancer Fund-raiser Calendar. All of these model ambassadors have been diagnosed with breast cancer before they turned 40."

The 2017 and 2018 calendars were successfully launched in 2016 and 2017 respectively. Models will begin to be painted with body paint and photographed for the 2019 calendar as early as February.

Your local breast cancer survivor, Kat Thompson, will be photographed in April. Sponsor of Kat's page in the 2019 Calender is Kingston Hervey Bay. Spokesperson Tracey Messer said, "Breast Cancer touches everybodies lives, every little bit that we can do helps. It is our way of giving back".

Kat shares some of her story here:

My journey with breast cancer began when I was diagnosed with triple negative breast cancer in late 2016 just after celebrating my youngest daughter, Daisy's 1st birthday returning to my job at a local law firm after my maternity leave and trying to live my life. I have 4 daughters and at that stage they were aged 1, 2, 15 and 18 years, my life was busy and so brilliant. From that point my life took a turn, I was shattered and shocked that at this young I'd been diagnosed with breast cancer, I didn't ever think that this would happen to me! My world and my family's world was rocked and turned on its head!! Over the next 12 months I underwent 2 operations to remove tumour in my breast and I had biopsies on my underarm lymph nodes with 2 removed. Then the chemotherapy started. I was hospitalised regularly for infections and severe side effects and then once that was done I underwent 30 radiotherapy treatments. I was in and out of hospital and medical appointments. I feel I have to now share my story to get other women regularly self checking, being breast aware and to help others understand and who may not know that breast cancer can present itself in any woman, it is not selective!

I'm so pleased and excited to be helping So Brave with their mission. If I can help to save even one person from my experience, or worse, it'll be worth it.

Rachelle adds: "Fund-raising from the 2019 calendar will support So Brave's Research Grants Program which will fund research to educate, prevent, diagnose, treat and monitor breast cancer in young women under 40."

\$1 from every 2019 Calendar sold will also be donated to the McGrath Foundation to continue our support of this fantastic organisation from our 2017 year of regional focus. We are proud to continue to support their 'angels on earth' the McGrath Breast Care Nurses in this way".

Kat would like to give the following tips to young women to educate them about breast cancer:

Take time out every month to self check your breasts, be aware of how they look, how they feel and if there are any changes from the last check or the one before. Don't be afraid to approach your GP about them. Follow the many self check info sheets available. Talk to your girlfriends, husbands, mums, boyfriends etc they're your support and listening ears.

Always listen to your inner voice, you know deep down what's going on with your breasts and if you don't then find out.

Kat would like to share the following with other breast cancer survivors and people who are currently going through breast cancer:

"You've got this! Don't be scared about breast cancer, don't let it get you down. Kick its butt, life is beautiful and stay strong!"

There are ways though, that you can make yourself stand out from the crowd when it comes to all three of these challenging moments.



Having said that though we have just finished a ten day gruelling rehearsal in Sydney practising some new material, One of those being an Aussie Rock Medley.


What can people expect if they come to see your show?







