Timomatic fills the stage with his energy and vibe. He has a positive, fun presence that you can't help but feel. You can tell that he adores performing and enjoys bringing the show to the people.

The multi-platinum artist had such a great time on the Fraser Coast as part of his regional tour last year that he has decided to head out on the road once again and visit places that he was unable to the first time, and that includes Hervey Bay.

Timomatic will be fully revived after recently holidaying in Los Angeles, this was his first decent holiday in two years and he said, "It was a great opportunity for me to get creative and to find some inspiration.

LA is a mecca for musical entertainment, and I find that there is a palpable energy there that helps to get the creative juices flowing". Asked where Timomatic's positive vibe comes from he says, "I honestly have a passion for people and what I do.

Being an African ethnic I like to shine the light on young guys like me that need the inspiration. I would like to see the next Timomatic African American star and help him achieve his dream.

I take being a role model very seriously and never take it for granted. I grew up with a dream to perform and that dream came true".

Soon we will get to see Timomatic on a regular basis on our TV screens as he has taken up a Judging gig on the much anticipated new series Dance Boss, Timomatic just knew that it was something that he wanted to do. Co-produced by Danni Minogue this show is bound to pack a punch.

Timomatic says, "This is a dance comp for everyday working people from nurses to McDonalds employees and everything in between, It is absolutely incredible".

Dance Boss is about different industries coming together, made up with people who have a passion for dance. The show is extremely relatable and made up of everyday people doing some pretty cool things. Best of all the series will feature some new music from the artist himself.

The next six months will see Timomatic take on a role in the new stage show called Madiba the Musical, a celebration of Nelson Mandela, this will be the first time that this musical will be performed in the English language, running for approximately three months the show will travel to Sydney, Canberra, Melbourne, Auckland, Adelaide and Perth.

In his down time Timomatic loves nothing more than playing soccer. He plays mixed, both indoors and outdoors every week when he is not on tour. In fact his team won their division title recently.

"Playing Soccer is like a breath of fresh air after being on tour and performing". Timomatic says.

As our interview drew to a close I thought I would throw a fun question into the mix. I asked Timomatic which super power he wished that he possessed, Timomatic said that he, "would love the ability to be in two places at once so as he can work and play at exactly the same time".

Timomatic says, "I can't wait to see you all in Hervey Bay, we are going to have a lot of fun together as I put on a great show for all of you".

WHEN THREE FORMER MASTERS APPRENTICES BAND MEMBERS ATTENDED THE FUNERAL OF THE GROUP'S LEGENDARY LEAD SINGER, JIM HEAYS, THEIR GRIEF AND RESPECT, EXPRESSED THROUGH COMBINED TALES AND FOND REMINISCENCES, RESULTED IN A NEW CONCEPT.

The inspired result – now called 'Dead Singer Band' – is an utterly unique offering. It stems from the fact that, as the band members reflected on how Jim's life should be celebrated, they realised he was one of many great Aussie singers they had been friends or played with over the years. These veteran musos, between them, had a collection of very personal and completely fresh stories to tell about a host of iconic lead vocalists (to start with, Colin was Bon Scott's tour roommate when he was the drummer for AC/DC...that alone makes the mind boggle!).

So after the wake, the work began. Roger's (very much alive) wife, Vanessa Lea, who is an exceptional singer with a career of her own, was recruited to complete a great band, and stories and footage were painstakingly collected and collated. What emerged is a fantastic one-of-a-kind production that includes an AV show as well as over 2 hours of cracking live music, delivered across 2 sets.

With authentic renditions of their music, the band is proud to honour the legacy of a prime selection of Australia's singing icons. Fans of Billy Thorpe, Ray Brown, Shirley Strachan, Ted Mulry, Darryl Cotton, Maurice and Robin Gibb, Bon Scott, Doc Neeson, Chrissy Amphlett, Michael Hutchence, Stevie Wright, Jon English and more, will love the visual and aural montage that Dead Singer Band delivers. The show pays fitting homage to the lives and times of the band members' mates and colleagues, with a truth that can only come from genuine experience. They toured, worked and partied with every artist featured, and in at least one case, were the very last people to have seen them alive. The close-up and personal recollections are what makes this tribute different. The packaging is the icing on the cake – from the accompanying audio visual show, light-hearted comedy, fun costuming, special guests, celebrity interviews, great music and sensitivity to the era of each artist.

Audiences come away with fresh insights and appreciation of the stars that they loved through the years, when their heroes were breaking down barriers and crafting unique sounds that are now recognised as Australian music.

Extravaganza



The Heritage City Quilt and Craft Extravaganza in Maryborough is an exciting weekend of craft hosted annually by the Rotary Club of Maryborough – Sunrise. 2018 is the sixth year for this premiere regional event for crafters, drawing crafters and craft suppliers from across south-east Queensland for two days of displays, demonstrations and workshops.

The Show is held on the same weekend as the City's iconic Mary Poppins Festival and challenges quilters to tell a story through their work, in keeping with the storytelling theme of the favourite character's writer.

The early months of winter bring a special delight for crafters when it is pleasant to sit in a quiet sunny nook and practice age-old crafts including quilting, patchwork, embroidery or paper-crafts. This annual event provides opportunities to learn new crafts, techniques or new projects.

Or to sit and admire the works of others in the Show and Tell session.

This year, Cath Quinlan from Accuquilt will host 'Make and Take' sessions and quilter extraordinaire Cheryl Bryant from Pfaff Husqvarna demonstrates their latest and greatest Quilting and Sewing machines.

Club President, Maria Carkagis proudly told What's On "as well as displays and sales of quilting and crafting supplies we also have a range of sellers of finished handicrafts."

"This is the perfect opportunity to buy supplies, a little something for someone special, or even to

start your Christmas shopping!" Mrs Carkagis said, "Come, try your hand at quilting techniques, paper crafts or hand sewing. Or just come to marvel at the skills and art of others."

Or try your luck at the roving raffles across the weekend.

Local Rotarians cooking skills are also on show – to top off a visit to City Hall, visitors are invited to stopover at our Event Café selling a range of freshly, home-made delicacies such as Devonshire Teas (we sold one a minute in the first hour last year!) or a savoury sandwich, soup or salad.

Perhaps most wondrous though, are the displays of Quilts that adorn the City Hall, whispering their stories to those who take the time to stand and listen. These quilts are reminders that treasured arts of our mothers and grandmothers are alive and well in this Heritage City. Reminders that we too can be wrapped in a swathe of hand-sewn love and magic as the winter days shorten and the winds arrive to carry that all-famous nanny in to the City!

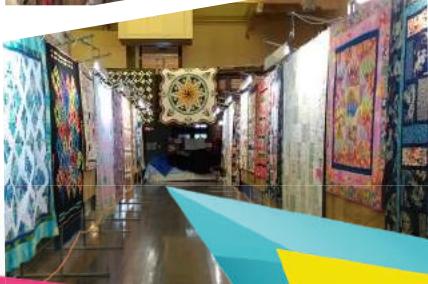
A People's Choice prize is awarded and all who come through the door are eligible to vote.

The Heritage City Quilt and Craft Extravaganza is held at the Maryborough City Hall in Kent Street, Maryborough on Saturday 7 and Sunday 8 July 2018. Doors open at 9 am each morning closing at 4 pm on Saturday and 3 pm on Sunday.

Entry is only \$5. Proceeds from the Event are directed toward supporting literacy programs in local primary schools.

THERE IS SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE AT THE MARYBOROUGH EISTEDDFOD

The Fraser Coast is a smorgasbord for performing arts, and there is no better showcase of this than the Maryborough Eisteddfod. Hosted at Maryborough's Brolga Theatre, the Maryborough Eisteddfod presents a variety of performances and pieces through the Dance, Vocal & Choral, Speech & Drama, Instrumental, and Literary sections. There's something for everybody's taste!

Competitors from the Fraser Coast and surrounds perform for an Adjudicator, a judge for each discipline who issues placings and prizes, but most importantly constructive feedback in their professional field, to the performers. It is an event which fuels development in a fun and enjoyable competitive atmosphere which supports the cultivation of local talent.

With the rising popularity and influx of competitors every year, the Dance portion of the Maryborough Eisteddfod is held from the 6th to the 10th of June, with the rest of the Disciplines being presented from the 4th to the 10th of August. Both events bringing us solos, small and large groups, as well as the Championship divisions for each Discipline, with Dance Championships being implemented this year.

Tickets to watch the event can be purchased from the box office at the Brolga Theatre on the day; an adult session ticket (typically a three-hour set of performances) is \$8, and \$6 for concession/students. An adult day ticket which grants access to that day's sessions is \$15, with concession/student tickets setting you back only \$10. For those

wanting a full experience of variety across all Disciplines, an adult ticket for the entire event (a season ticket) will cost \$40, and a concession/student ticket for the same totals \$30. Programmes are available for purchase for \$5.

There are a variety of genres and sections to compete in, and all ages receive professional feedback on their performances. While the event is a competition, the Maryborough Eisteddfod aims to present an atmosphere based on fair play, friendly rivalry, and collective improvement of skill. As the new Allied Health Manager at St Stephen's hospital in Hervey Bay, I am excited to be tasked with guiding our enthusiastic team into the future of hospital care at this fully digital hospital. Having originally studied in Auckland, New Zealand, I have been a proud resident of Australia for the last six years. At one point or another my wife Frances and I have considered making Melbourne, Forster and the Gold Coast our home while working within private hospitals. Settling on Hervey Bay was an easy task as we were both welcomed into the community with open arms and we look forward to calling the Fraser Coast our home for many years to come.

My initial desire as a student was to go into sports physiotherapy, however, having placements within rehabilitation units quickly changed my focus. Being a part of helping people recover after injury, surgery or general deterioration in function is an experience which can't be beaten. This role as the Allied health Manager has allowed me to go a step further by participating in governance and the production of services and facilities which are new to St Stephen's Hospital and the Wide Bay region.

Parkinson's disease rehabilitation, oncology rehabilitation and hand therapy are areas which we have developed with our clinical staff and have gradually built up to successful services. We have also been fortunate enough to be tasked with building of two new purpose built gyms and consulting areas. Having access to new facilities is something not many allied health professionals can claim. I am very excited that my first few months with St Stephen's has been busy developing and organising resources which will assist staff in providing quality care and benefit the patients we are here to serve.



Our future as a rehabilitation department is just as exciting as what we are currently doing. On the horizon we are investigating the possibility of installing a hydrotherapy pool. Having previously had access to a hydrotherapy pool I am keen to participate in the implementation of this unique service to our inpatient and day rehabilitation programs. The exciting part of having hydrotherapy is the accessibility the public will have as well. Our vision is to open up times for private clinicians and groups which would typically be limited to standard avenues of rehabilitation and miss the benefits hydrotherapy provides.



ST STEPHEN'S HOSPITAL REHABILITATION SERVICES



St Stephen's Hospital in Hervey Bay is now offering inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation services for patients who have had major surgery, patients with back and neck conditions, as well as patients with neurological conditions including Parkinson's Disease.

The 32-bed rehabilitation ward includes a purpose-built gym to provide outstanding rehabilitation programs to support focused Inpatient Rehabilitation programs and Day Therapy programs. Patients also have access to the expertise of an interdisciplinary team including Rehabilitation Physicians, Nursing Staff, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, an Exercise Physiologist, a Social Worker, a Dietician and a Speech Pathologist.

The Inpatient Rehabilitation Program has been created for patients who require intensive rehabilitation following major orthopaedic surgery, including total hip and knee replacements, spinal surgery or those who have been involved in major trauma. Similarly, patients with neurological conditions are able to access the inpatient rehabilitation program, including patients who have had strokes, those who have Parkinson's disease, Multiple Sclerosis, Spinal Cord Injuries, Head Injuries and Motor Neurone Disease. We also offer cancer rehabilitation, respiratory rehabilitation, rehabilitation for amputees, including fitting prostheses and general rehabilitation for patients who are deconditioned following an admission to one of the acute wards with serious medical or surgical conditions.

Our Day Therapy Program is designed for patients who can manage at home, but still require ongoing rehabilitation. Common programs include cardiac rehabilitation, musculoskeletal rehabilitation for non-surgical back and neck conditions, chronic pain programs and specialised hand therapy for patients who have had hand surgery. St Stephen's rehabilitation services also include classes. We run specific classes for patients with Parkinson's Disease twice weekly, along with classes for patients who are undergoing cancer treatment. The aim of these classes is to maintain the patient's strength and conditioning while undergoing chemotherapy.

Regardless of the challenging situations our patients may be facing, our goal at St Stephen's Hospital is to make rehabilitation a positive experience. Our aim is to support patients to the point where they can live independently in their own homes, enjoying a fulfilling life in their community. JOIN THE PCYC EMERGENCY SERVICES CADETS AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE

It's not every day that you find a like-minded group of people that all have a passion for making the world we live in a better place. The PCYC Emergency Services Cadets are just such a group. Founded in 2014 in response to Government priorities for youth development and community resilience, the program, as the name suggests, does run under the umbrella of the PCYC (Police Citizens Youth Clubs Queensland) but it is in a very unique partnership with the Queensland Fire and Emergency Services that looks at making sure that the development of young people and their communities is achieved in a productive manner.

This committed group of young people all fit into the age bracket of 12 – 17, excluding the adult leaders, who are over the age of 18. From first entering the program, Emergency Cadet members begin to gain a wealth of knowledge in community service and many other aspects of emergency procedures to help in times of need. There is a lot more that is undertaken by the Emergency Services than just fighting the more common natural disasters. They also, aid in planning for large disaster events such as storms and floods, the rescuing of marine vehicles,

train to obtain surf life saving skills, and undertake charity activities, all of which can make a real difference to a community in need.

Many of us know response teams and other similar organisations are extremely beneficial when it comes to surviving these hard and catastrophic moments. That is exactly what the Emergency Cadet programme is here for, the training and mentoring of young people in our communities with the intention that some will find careers in emergency services and others will continue to volunteer to help save lives and protect our community on the Fraser Coast as adults.

"Visitors can step aboard to check out the many whale watching vessels, enjoy a sail past, see a great live performance by Hervey Bay's Leonie Kingdom, who recently topped Triple J's Unearthed chart, and watch the fantastic fireworks display," he said.

"These days it's joined with stalls selling great-tasting food for families to grab something quick, easy and affordable to eat plus a host of kids' entertainment such as face painting and rides."

The Aloha Mai E chant will be performed by Hervey Bay's Leandra Gurbiel who has been trained in Hawaii.

"The chant is a calling to the humpback whales, invoking the blessing of migration," she said.

Ms Gurbiel said it was also about bringing the community together for love and connection and wishing a safe journey to those on the water.

The activities on the day will also include a Marine Rescue Hervey Bay open day from 2pm to 5pm at the Great Sandy Straits Marina to promote awareness of the volunteer service.

Vice-Commodore Jill Barclay said people would be able to tour the base, step aboard their boats, see displays such as life rafts, ask boating questions and find out more about volunteering.

"We are on call 24-hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year," she said.

"Probably about a third of the work we do is medical evacuations from Fraser Island."

She said the marine rescue crew also monitored radio messages and helped with search and rescue operations.

Mr Bowers said it was always terrific to see crowds come out supporting the whale fleet and making the most of the magnificent marina.

CANADIAN

It is thought that the Nanaimo Bar was named after the town Nanaimo, on Vancouver Island. The beauty of this dessert bar is that it requires no baking. Over the years many different varieties of the bar have been created. According to Wikipedia, the first known Nanaimo Bar recipe was published in 1953. These bars are a favourite, and super easy to make.

Topping

4 oz semisweet chocolate, chopped
2 Tbsp unsalted butter
Sea salt, for sprinkling (optional)

Method:

Melt the chocolate and butter in a metal bowl placed over a pot of simmering water, stirring gently with a spatula until melted. Cool the chocolate slightly and then pour over the filling. If you want sprinkle the top with a little sea salt. Chill the pan in the fridge for about 2 hours before slicing into bars.

Nanaimo Bars



Crust

1 cup of cracker crumbs (but digestives or marie biscuits work just as well)
3 Tbsp cocoa powder
½ tsp salt
1 cup sweetened coconut flakes
½ cup walnut pieces
6 Tbsp unsalted butter, melted
1 large egg, lightly beaten

Method:

1. Preheat the oven to (180 °C) or . 350 °F. Lightly grease a 20 cm square pan and line it with grease proof paper making sure that you include the sides.
2. For the crust, combine the cracker crumbs with the cocoa powder and salt, then, add the coconut & walnut pieces. Stir in the melted butter and the egg and stir until blended. Press this into the bottom of the prepared pan and bake for 12 minutes. Cool the crust completely before preparing the filling.

Filling

½ cup unsalted butter, left at room temperature
2 cups icing sugar, sifted
2 Tbsp vanilla custard powder
Pinch of salt
3 Tbsp milk
1 tsp vanilla extract

Method:

By hand, beat the butter with 1 cup of the icing sugar, the custard powder and a pinch of salt until smooth. Add the milk and vanilla and beat in, then beat in the remaining cup of icing sugar. Without over beating, you want the filling smooth. Spread this evenly over the cooled crust.

LOCAL MUSICIAN SPOTLIGHT WITH

FRANK BENN



Local musician Frank Benn is very well known across the Fraser Coast. With his cool tones, huge smile and great melodies he certainly knows how to draw a crowd. Over a cup of coffee we talked about his childhood, music and dreams.

- Kim, Editor - What's On Fraser Coast.

Tell us a bit about your childhood and who your musical inspiration was?

I was born in Fiji, Suva in 1983, but only lived there for six months. My parents took me to Auckland, New Zealand. We moved to Waiheke Island when I was about two years old, this is a half an hour boat trip from Auckland. I was on the island for about eighteen years.

The island is absolutely beautiful. Everybody knows everybody it is a really tight community and a great place to grow up.

All of my Fijian family were musical, my dad not so much. But if they didn't sing they played the guitar. Or they were in a choir. Music has always been in my blood, and I knew at a very young age that this was what I wanted to do for a living.

What Genre of music do you play?

My style is a funky coasty kind of jazz blues, a bit of everything, but no one thing in particular.

What is your most memorable gig to date and why?

There have been so many good gigs but one of my most memorable gigs was being the opening act for the Black Sorrows in Ipswich it was a great experience, I got to sit in this green room with a bunch of talented Australian musicians that have been there and done that and are still doing it. I got to play on all of this amazing sound gear as well, The Black Sorrows were great.

Do you write any of your own material?

I have written a lot of songs and recorded about thirty songs to date. Sometimes a song just comes to you, bang it just flows and sometimes I can be sitting down having a conversation and someone will say a word and it will just kick-start something. Usually it is just an idea and then I will

have a brainstorm and feed off that.

I always carry a little book with me to write down words and ideas in. Then I will bring a melody into it I think it just depends, it can be just a word or I will see a story on television and I will think that it is a really magical story that I could write a good heartfelt song about. I don't always write from my point of view, but I sometimes do perspective writing, I will write about what I think the subject is going through.

There is a particular song I wrote about my brother in Law Mitchi that song is called 'Other side' and is on my latest album, it is written from what I would believe would be his point of view.

I have done three albums in Australia, two with the band Chops. One called 'Chops Raw', then my most recent called 'The Frank Benn Trio', and in-between those two albums an Independent album called 'Visual Images' that I recorded in Gympie.

What can people expect if they come to see you perform?

They can feel raw emotion. When I am doing gigs I like to keep everyone in the room happy that is why I play so many different genres, I want them to feel relaxed. I want them to feel what I am playing whether it is with sadness or dance.

Why the Guitar?

The guitar is an instrument that you can carry with you no matter where you go. You can create melodies as well as keeping your baseline all in one. There is just something about the guitar. I would almost say that it is my form of meditation, in those three or so minutes that you are playing a song you just kind of forget about everything else, it all makes sense while you are playing.

What is your dream for the future?

I would like to be known as an original artist, and for something other than Brown Eyed Girl, (laughs). I would also like to do more opening support acts for national or international artists. Doing a lot more festivals both here and out of town would top it all off nicely.
