What is the recipe for a magic show that is sure to excite, take you to new dizzying heights, Conjure up lots of mischief and mayhem, and that is a little bit naughty.....Oh ok, a lot naughty. Well look no further than Mike Tyler and Christopher Wayne, creators of the hit magic show called, 'The Naked Magicians', and yes we did just use the word naked.

I caught up with Mike Tyler a couple of weeks ago to find out what this show was all about.

We established that both Mike and Christopher are best friends which is just as well considering where they take the show, and how much they actually get to see of each other.

Mike says of Christopher, " He is definitely more on the creative side, he is a very funny guy. Christopher's brain works differently to other people's though, he likes to start a conversation half way through so you have no idea what he is talking about, Over the years I have got used to it though, he is a good dude".

Both magicians had fully clothed solo careers doing corporate gigs but wanted to find a new more engaging way to deliver a magic show, after watching the movie 'Magic Mike' inspiration came to the pair. Mike says, "All the magicians to that point were cheesy stereotypes with a top hat and a wand. After seeing Magic Mike we came up with the idea of coming up with the worlds naughtiest magic show".

After practising for about a year, two weeks before their sold out live show Chris and Mike booked out a hall in Brisbane that seated about one hundred people. All their friends, family and face-book friends were invited for free, at the end each audience member was asked to fill in a feedback form. Suffice to say that the show changed quite a bit after that.

Of their first ever live public show at the Brisbane Comedy Festival Mike says, " My heart was beating out of my chest and I was so sweaty, I was hardly feeling attractive I can tell you". But the boys received a very positive response and knew that they were onto something.

During the course of my thorough research I also found out that Mike competed in the national Swimming Championships and the Pan Pacific Games as a youngster and thinks that being scantily clad in Speedos put him in good stead for undressing on stage.

Having travelled around Australia, America, Canada, Edinburgh, Scotland, New Zealand, the UK and Hong Kong, these guys are seasoned travellers. 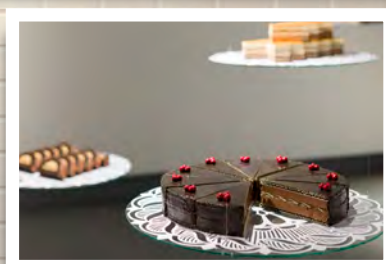
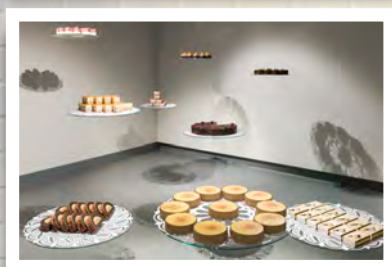
He continues with, " We know the Fraser Coast is known for its weather, well we will bring the heat to the coast. Don't expect to come and just watch be prepared to be part of the show".

## A CONSUMER'S GUIDE TO UNOBTAINABLE HAPPINESS

**Currently studying a Doctor of Visual Arts at Queensland College of Art (Griffith University) in Brisbane, Susan Gourley is an emerging, interdisciplinary artist whose practice employs salvaged material to address environmental issues and concerns. In *A Consumer's Guide to Unobtainable Happiness*, the artist has created over three hundred and thirty hand crafted faux French-inspired patisseries from discarded cardboard, paper, and polystyrene. Her aim is to question the role of consumerism in a global world. In particular, the acceleration of environmental degradation due to the extraction of natural resources as a result of mass production and consumption.**

In a bid to try and understand the impulse and drive of consumerism, Gourley has chosen a culinary aesthetic, as food is something that every single human being can relate to. In this context, the artist utilises an elite refinement of 'taste' and 'luxury' as a metaphor to explore, reveal and question the dynamics of consumerism, including the aesthetics of display. The tension between subject matter and materiality is further enhanced through repetition, mimicry, and satire. As a result, *A Consumer's Guide to Unobtainable Happiness* is a theatrical wonderland of suspended glass plates, each one adorned with hyperreal tableaux patisseries. The ornate and textual qualities of the patisseries also create the allure and illusion of delicacies and sumptuous pleasure, relayed through the ostentatious display of plenty. The spectacle is further enhanced through the light play of intricately hand stencilled doilies.

The inspiration for this work began in 2015, when Gourley was invited to teach art at The Buttery, a not-for-profit rehab program for alcohol, drug and problem gambling located on the Far North Coast of New

South Wales. Here, the artist introduced a tactile approach to teaching by looking to the creative vision and oeuvre of American artist Robert Rauschenberg, who used every day and discarded materials including cardboard to create sculptural objects. The first class proved to be so successful with residents that it ran over several weeks and produced some outstanding work. So much so, that it inspired Gourley to go back to her studio and start making sculptural objects of her own. Over a period of six months, the artist extended beyond her own familiar artist territory by assembling, disassembling and reassembling salvaged material to emulate objects inspired by French cuisine. Rather than buying pre-mixed paint colours, Gourley chose to make up her own paint palette to simulate different shades of chocolate and other confectionery delights. Whilst this process sounds easy, it was incredibly laborious, and fraught with uncertainty and constant frustration. Thus, what began as excitement and curiosity, led to an obsession to see how far the artist could push salvaged material in terms of transforming rubbish into artefacts that had the capacity to critique important and relevant issues in a contemporary art space.

Gourley explains how consumerism has ironically at times been regarded as a means to social progress, pleasure, and the fulfilment of happiness. By creating delectable and desirable objects out of rubbish however, the artist hopes to draw attention to the emotional inducements embodied in twenty first century consumer culture, and their continuing environmental impact which affects us all, including the human and non-human world.

***A Consumer's Guide to Unobtainable Happiness* is on display at the Hervey Bay Regional Gallery from Friday 11th May until Sunday 17th June. Everyone is welcome to attend opening night on Friday 11th May from 6-8pm. Location is 166 Old Maryborough Road, Pialba. There will also be a children's workshop. own music as I had to listen to all of theirs. I heard every style of music over the years from blues to classic and rock. I was like a sponge and just soaked it all up. So musically I can sing lots of things.

**I am a huge Noiseworks fan and know just about every song word for word. How does it feel to hear your songs being played decades later?**

When you do a show it is beautiful, we are all sharing an experience and there is a lot of respect. Music means different things to different people. But as an artist I am still trying to be better, to come up with that quintessential song.

**In 2016 you recorded a new album called Starlight, tell us a little bit about this album?**

I got to play and write songs with musician, songwriter and producer from the Eurythmics, Dave Stewart and music legend Ringo Star. We actually recorded at Ringo's house. I grew up with him in the Beatles so it was a dream come true. Music is really a great equaliser that brings many people together.

**You have also had a huge solo career, what do you attribute to your longevity?**

Stupidity, (laughs), I should have been dead a few times over the years. I am still living life and loving it. I believe that I am better now than I ever was. I can definitely say that I am in a happy place.

**In 1992, you played the role of Judas in the Australian production of Jesus Christ Superstar. Alongside Kate Ceberano and John Farnham, what do you remember about this production?**

Yes I did the Arena version for four months and over a million people saw the show. Then I did the theatre version for another eight months this was such a great experience.

In 2012/2013 I was then asked to play Pontius Pilate in the English version of Jesus Christ Superstar Arena Spectacular. I did this for two months and it was amazing.

**What is life like on tour, on the road?**

I have my band around me, so when you have the right people around you that are good mates it makes the experience so much better, we keep it fun. We do our gigs and then get together afterwards and have a beer.

It can be very tedious travelling around from place to place. It is hard yakka and very long hours. You definitely have to have stamina that's for sure.

**Tell us a bit about the 'Best Of Tour'?**

You will hear me play songs from everything I have ever done, so decades of music. I have my full rock band. We all have a very beautiful big sing along.

**Do you have a special message for the people of the Fraser Coast?**

If you are coming to see my show you are a lucky bugger, (laughs). I am looking forward to coming to the Fraser Coast once again as it is a great part of the world.

Growing up I have to admit that I was a huge fan of Jon Stevens, and absolutely loved his band Noiseworks, so you can imagine how thrilled I was to have a chat with him about his upcoming, SOLD-OUT show.

## English style Steak and kidney Pudding



Guest Recipe: **Rod Pettet - Author**

**This is an old pub favourite and the ingredients do not need to be too precise! Cooked as a suet pudding not a pie crust.**

**The recipe for Steak and Kidney Pudding first saw print in about 1861 in Suxxex, England, since then there have been many variations, this one is delicious. Traditionally from England this is one recipe that you will love.**

### Ingredients for 6 small puddings or 1 large

1kg of braising steak, trimmed of all fat and gristle, cut into 2cm cubes  
50g gram of Ox kidney well-trimmed and again cut into 2 cm cubes. (Can use lamb but Ox is better)  
8 medium onions diced  
250 g of mushrooms chopped  
3 large carrots diced  
4 celery stalks diced  
½ tsp of chopped fresh thyme  
1 garlic clove crushed  
50 g unsalted butter for to Sauté vegetables or use a little olive oil  
2 litres of beef or veal stock  
1 bottle of dark beer eg Guinness (optional)  
Salt and pepper to taste

### Method:

Combine chicken pieces, vinegar, garlic, chicken stock, black peppercorns, bay leaf, soy sauce cover and leave to marinate in the refrigerator for 2 hours.

Transfer the chicken mixture to a large heavy based pan or wok and bring to boil. Reduce heat, cover and simmer for 30 minutes. Remove lid from pan and continue cooking until chicken is tender or until the liquid has reduced by half. Serve with rice.

NOTE: You can also used pork instead of chicken.

## ENGLISH

### For the suet pastry

450 g (1lb) plain flour  
25 g (1 oz) baking powder  
100 g (4 oz) fresh suet, chopped  
100 g (4 oz) dried suet  
300 ml (10fl oz) water

Or do as I usually do and cheat by using Tandaco Suet Mix. Follow instructions on packet.

### Method:

Grease two 1.2 litre pudding basins or six 400 ml moulds. For the steak and kidney filling, fry the beef and kidney in the dripping or oil, allowing it to colour well on all sides.

In a separate large pan, sweat the diced vegetables, garlic and herbs in the butter for a few minutes until soft. Add the Guinness and boil to reduce until almost dry. Add the meat and cover with the jus. Bring to the simmer, cover, and simmer for 1-1½ hours until the meat is tender. Check the seasoning and allow to cool. While the meat is cooking, make the suet pastry. Sieve the flour, baking powder and a pinch of salt into a bowl. Mix in the suet then fold in the water to form a firm pastry. Allow the pastry to rest for about 20 minutes. Roll out the pastry and use the majority to line the pudding moulds. Keep some for the lids. Keep in the fridge until needed.

When the filling is cold, fill the moulds with the meat mixture, using a slotted spoon. You need only a little liquid in the filling. Roll out the remaining suet paste and cover the moulds, trim and press together. Top with pieces of buttered foil. (use an elastic band if loose). Stand the puddings in a steamer or a pan half-filled with hot water, cover and steam for about 1 hour for the smaller puddings and 1 ½ -2 hours for the larger ones, topping up with boiling water as necessary.

The liquid left from the stew can be re-boiled, pushed through a sieve and used as the gravy.

To serve, trim round the tops. Turn the individual puddings out on to hot plates and cover with the gravy. From the larger basins, cut and spoon on to hot plates and cover with gravy.

Traditionally served with mashed potato and peas.

# LOCAL MUSICIAN SPOTLIGHT WITH SHAUN BECKETT



**IF YOU FREQUENT THE PUBS AND CLUBS ON THE FRASER COAST CHANCES ARE YOU HAVE HEARD OF LOCAL MUSICIAN SHAUN BECKETT IN ONE FORM OR ANOTHER. I WAS LUCKY ENOUGH TO SIT DOWN AND HAVE A CONVERSATION WITH HIM A COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO ABOUT GROWING UP, MUSIC AND THE FUTURE. TO FIND OUT WHERE SHAUN IS PLAYING NEXT TURN TO OUR GIG GUIDE.**

Tell us a bit about your childhood, who was your musical inspiration?

I was born in Ferntree Gully in Victoria. I was the youngest of four, I have two sisters and an older brother. We are all quite a loving family and went on camping trips. We also had lots of family sing a longs as my family were from a Yorkshire background so there was lots of spoons and Ukuleles, and some pretty hilarious nights.

We moved to Hervey Bay in 78 so I was only about six or seven at the time. I loved growing up in Hervey Bay it was a very small place back then. We would bike ride, watch the train go past each morning, it was a very different place as we didn't have the development that you see now. There was no traffic lights. There were lots of little spots that we could get into harmless mischief.

My musical inspiration came from my brothers and sisters. My brother was a mad sweet fan so I heard the Rebel Rouser and Ballroom Blitz lots of times. My sisters were crazy Abba fans so they would steal mums 70's platform shoes and do dress-ups in the hallway. The 80's were when music really started to dawn on me, and it came by the way of KISS and the music video era with videos like 'video killed the radio star', MTV and the Kenny Everett Video Show.

**DO YOU WRITE ANY OF YOUR OWN MATERIAL?**

Yes I probably started writing music about 10 to 15 years ago

It was always hard to complete a song sometimes you try to hard. You get a bit of a song and sometimes it can stay that way for years and then it just kinda drops off. Nowadays I find that there's a window that I can use, and if I don't get interrupted and am able to have that moment I can get something down and it just happens like that.

Songs relate to people in all different ways, It is nice when you can touch someone with a song. I wrote a song called 'Fly in Fly Out Blues' about people during the mining boom flying in and out and going through the blues. It brought this robust man to tears one day, the song really hit a nerve, he could relate to it. That is the biggest compliment I have had with one of my songs.

**WHAT CAN PEOPLE EXPECT IF THEY COME TO WATCH YOU PERFORM?**

I think it depends on which format you see me in. If it is in the band, Bay City Rock, you will see our four piece rock band playing rock covers. It will be a night of rock and rifts.

I play in two Duo's one being 'Beckett Turner Overdrive' with seasoned soloist, Dave Turner. We put together some nice harmonies.

Then there's 'Timber and Steel' with young guitarist Kye Williams who brings the electric side to my solo stuff. This means we can have certain hooks and songs which I can't quite do by myself.

Then there is just me, Shaun Beckett I think my forte is a cruisy afternoon Sunday sesh. I don't like to jump down peoples throats with my solo stuff, I would rather allow people to choose to listen and I find I win people over by a song or two.

**WHAT WOULD YOU LIKE THE NEXT EIGHT MONTHS TO BRING YOU?**

A full calendar and an album would be great. This would be my first. I have made many great friends through making music over the decades, I feel very fortunate. I also try to live a full life as it is not a rehearsal. One mistake we all make is thinking that you have time.


