

Firing up the DRAGON classics with



For over five decades, Dragon has been a staple of the Australian music scene, with their timeless hits, electric live shows, and a legacy that continues to evolve. Behind the backing vocals and unmistakable riffs is guitarist Bruce Reid, a Canadian-born musician whose journey from snowy Montreal to the sunsoaked stages of Australia is as fascinating as the band's own story. I caught up with Bruce ahead of Dragon's return to Hervey Bay, where he shared insights into his life, the music, and the band that still has crowds dancing after fifty years.

I first met Bruce Reid in 2017 when Dragon was performing in Hervey Bay. I had interviewed founding member Todd Hunter via phone a few weeks earlier, and by the time the band arrived in town, I was eager to see them perform. I had grown up with their music in the 80s and loved their sound.

Bruce Reid, Dragon's guitarist since 2006, brings a unique flavour to the group. He moved to Australia in 1993 at age 37. He mostly grew up in Montreal, a city he remembers fondly for its vibrant seasons.

"Montreal has the most beautiful summers and falls," Bruce recalls. "Then a very long winter. As a kid, I'd ski and play ball hockey in the snow. Touring was always a challenge, though, as you had to keep track of your car in case a storm buried it, or warm it up between sets if it was minus 25. But it's a truly beautiful place."

When it comes to his music, Bruce is known as a slide guitar specialist, and over the years, that skill has only deepened.

"I started with a pedal steel guitar, mainly used in country music, when I was in my first band. It had ten strings and pedals that changed the pitch of the strings as you played. I later sold it. "Then just last year I invested in a really good one. Before that, I used a lap steel, just a plank of wood with six strings that sits on your lap. Plug it into an amp and you can sound like a cat in heat in the backyard," he laughs.

Within a year of arriving in Australia, Bruce found himself playing for Wendy Matthews. He did some recording with her, which turned into an 11-year run as her guitarist. His move to Dragon came later, in late 2006.

"Wendy was taking a break, and Todd Hunter called asking if I wanted to record for an album called *Sunshine to Rain*, which was part of the Liberation Blue Acoustic Series and released under the Liberation Music label.

"The label helped '70s and '80s bands record acoustic versions of their hits and get back on the road. It gave us freedom to rearrange songs and perform them differently, which helped me since I didn't know Dragon's back catalogue too well at the time."

Bruce had caught glimpses of Dragon's legacy over the years; he'd seen them featured in a *Countdown* special and used to spot the band going to rehearsals when he and Wendy's band were at Stage Door Rehearsal Studios in Alexandria in New South Wales.

"Our soundman was close to Todd and recommended me and drummer Pete Drummond when Todd needed new players. That's how it all started. Todd and I began rehearsing at my workplace, TAFE NSW Ultimo, and that's where the whole adventure began."

Initially, Bruce thought he could juggle both the Wendy Matthews Band and Dragon, but Dragon quickly became a full-time commitment.

Interestingly, Bruce and Wendy shared more than just music—they grew up in the same Montreal neighbourhood, NDG (*Notre-Dame-de-Grâce*).

"I used to hang out on her street and play sports with her brother. Wendy left Montreal young to pursue music in LA, but we had a lot of commonalities before reconnecting in Australia."

Bruce also played with *The Catholics*, a respected Sydney jazz group, and was a member of ARIA award-winning *Karma County*.

In July of 2008, Dragon was inducted into the ARIA Hall of Fame, and joined on stage by James Reyne and Ian Moss to perform *Rain* and *April Sun in Cuba*. In the years that followed, *Dragon* released previously unreleased recordings, including the album *Happy I Am* in 2009 under the Ozmomusic label.

"All of us are songwriters," Bruce says. "We just keep creating. Even if a new song doesn't become a hit like *Rain* or *Are You Old Enough*, we have to keep writing. Occasionally, we sneak in a new one during shows, and if it keeps the crowd bopping, we're happy."

One lesser-known fact in Dragon's story is their connection to John Farnham's hit *Age of Reason*.

Bruce says, "Todd Hunter and Johanna Pigott wrote that song for John after a direct request. It sat on a record executive's desk for a while until making its way back into Farnham's hands.

"There's actually a version with Marc Hunter singing the song that wasn't released at the time, but we included it on *Sunshine to Rain* as a bonus track, with Mark Williams also doing a version. It's a fan favourite once we tell them who actually wrote it!"

Dragon continued to evolve, releasing Chase the Sun and The Great Divide in 2011. That year, they played the Rhythm and Vines Festival in New Zealand, an experience Bruce won't forget.

"We barely got to Gisborne because of heavy fog. The field was empty before we went on, and we thought, 'Great, we travelled four hours for this.' But by the middle of our set, 15,000 people had turned up, as the other bands had finished. They knew all the words. Dragon still has a huge following in New Zealand."





Dragon toured extensively with their 40th Anniversary Tour, The Long Way to the Top, and the Red Hot Summer Tour with Jimmy Barnes in 2012/13 as standouts.

"The first Red Hot Summer gig was 45 degrees on the stage. I was nearly fainting; it was brutal, a true test of endurance. That was indeed a red-hot summer!"

In 2012, they released The *Dragon Years – 40th Anniversary Collection*, a two-CD set that peaked at No. 21 in New Zealand.

These days, Bruce lives in the Blue Mountains, surrounded by fellow musicians. When not on tour, he still teaches Music Industry at TAFE NSW Ultimo, where he's taught for 25 years. Teaching fits perfectly around touring with Dragon.


Bruce holds a special fondness for Hervey Bay, calling it "gorgeous" and one of his favourite places to visit. He even went whale watching here back in 1993.

Dragon's setlist is a hit parade, finely tuned for maximum momentum.

"We have a set that just rolls with about fifteen songs that are in the DNA. It's remarkable how many hits Dragon actually has. The music will have people singing, dancing, and rocking out to the very end. It will be a typical Dragon gig, full of energy, memories, and great melodies."

The Sounds of Rock Festival in Hervey Bay is on Saturday, September 6 and is set to deliver an unforgettable day of music, featuring an incredible lineup including Jon Stevens, The Angels, Baby Animals, Pseudo Echo, Dragon, Eurogliders and Taxiride (with Jason Singh).





Yoga & Whale Watching By Peta Johansen Photo credit - Kim Parnell

Voyage deeper.

That's the ethos behind the unlikely pairing of our region's popular whale watching season with the practice of yoga.

Gaia Health and Life Coaching owner and certified yoga instructor Sara Ashdown inherited the program from a fellow yogi who moved away. But Sara instantly saw the connection between the two.

"In Western culture, we tend to focus on the physical side of yoga, which is great, it's really good for our physical health. But yoga also encompasses our emotional and mental health and how we live our lives.

"How it connects to the whales is that sense of connection with nature and other beings on this planet. The true sense of yoga is "ahimsa," that's our first yama (or tenet), it is kindness to all beings.

"With that in mind, what we're looking for is - yes, we want to see the whales and appreciate their beauty and majesty - but also have that connection with another species on a more spiritual level."

Sara is also a diver, animal activist and sound healing practitioner who brings her experience and knowledge to build a cohesive experience on land and water over two Sundays in August. This program fuels her passion for connectedness between humans and animals in her favourite environment, the ocean.

"There's plenty of peer-reviewed research showing the profoundly uplifting and healing effects of being with these animals, from all over the world.

"It's fun interacting with whales, but there's a very real side to healing even for those of us that just go for the pleasure of it."

The day-long program begins with yoga, meditation and sound healing before lunch and an afternoon boat trip to

meet with the whales. Sara expects the morning session will enhance the group's experience out on the water. "With the yoga, we're doing the inner work and connecting with ourselves first, and that then enables us to connect on a




much deeper level with other beings.

"When we're doing this sort of meditation workshop, we're connecting with that energy."

As a totem animal, whales represent family, freedom, intelligence and spirituality.

"Family doesn't necessarily mean blood relatives but



"The research now is saying that they have what we call 'basic culture,' which we only thought was in the human animal. So, culture being that they're passing on songs, they're passing on knowledge.

"Dolphins, whales... they all communicate by sonar. So that is all vibration. That is frequency, and we now know, particularly the stuff I am doing with sound baths (crystal singing bowls), is that frequency can heal.

"There does seem to be something profoundly beautiful about these animals, and they seem to find us as fascinating as we find them."

Through paddleboard yoga and sound healing, Sara has seen interactions between marine animals and humans enhanced by crystal singing bowls.

"Dolphins slowly came up to us, we've had turtles doing the same thing. Fish, stingrays, they all interact. We are all connected by it."

And that's what she envisions for the Yoga & Whale Watching program. Fitness or experience in yoga is not necessary - Sara just encourages anyone prepared to journey inward as well as out on the water.

"Anyone wanting to have a little bit more of a connection, that profound feeling of connecting with another species on, dare I say it, a slightly deeper level."

The program runs from 9am to 5pm on Sundays, August 10, and August 17.

Creating Connected Communities

What would you do if you could do anything?

It's a simple question that can spark some amazing conversations about the future of our community.

I recently had the privilege of presenting to Year 10 students from one of our local high schools, introducing them to The Neighbourhood Hive - HBNC's learning and innovation hub.

In the spirit of innovation, the workshops ended with a brainstorming exercise focused on creating a new community space that brought something valuable to Hervey Bay.

To really get the creativity going, I took the reins off and told the students there were no rules – even the laws of gravity and physics need not apply.

What they came up with was truly inspiring.

There were anti-gravity zones, frozen and underwater worlds, and concepts that would require some VERY generous sponsors to get off the ground.

There were also ideas that showed heartfelt community spirit – like a collaborative garden, and a communal space for our home-schoolers.

All of this, and much more, was generated in about 20 minutes of group brainstorming.

Just imagine what they could have come up with in a full day or week!

I wonder how much we could achieve by making more of an effort to meaningfully engage with Fraser Coast youth.

By simply asking them what they want for their community in a fun, low-pressure environment, a whole range of ideas were sparked.

Given time, teamwork and resources, who knows how far these ideas could go?

Perhaps without even realising it, we can all tend to shut down ideas before they have a chance to see the light of day.

It's too expensive, it's too hard, we've tried it before, it will never work...sound familiar?

I'll leave you with the same message I left with those Year 10 students – dream big.

Dream about what could happen, not why it can't. You never know where your idea could take you.

LOCAL ARTIST SPOTLIGHT

Kerri Dixon Living the dream

For local artist Kerri Dixon, life before moving to Brooweena to 'Live the Dream' was hectic to say the least. After twenty-seven years running a sign manufacturing business in Brisbane, the daily grind wore thin for Kerri and her husband, then their kids grew up and started to leave home. Craving change, they sold everything and bought a farm, despite having no farming experience. Kerri, now semi-retired, made one request: the property had to include room for an art studio so she could finally focus on her passion.

Swapping city life for a rural farm was a culture shock for Kerri and her husband.

"Going from the stress of running your own business, trying to make ends meet, and wondering where the next pay is coming from, to selling everything and becoming debt-free made all the difference.

"The stress levels dropped to zero, and we were able to truly relax for the first time in years.

Part of the dream was to become semi-self-sufficient farmers on their 180-acre property, but reality hit hard. Kerri tried selling eggs with one hundred free-range chickens and even had a custom-built chicken tractor. But after thirteen hours a week, egg-stamping, and market days, she was barely breaking even.

They also tried cattle and sheep, only to discover they would need 1,000 acres to make it profitable. Even the veggie garden didn't thrive.

"All my big farming dreams went out the window after about a year," Kerri laughs.

She soon remembered why she made the move: to focus on her art. She converted the double garage into a studio and joined local art societies, entering small comps with her pastel work. When they asked her to teach, she nervously ran her first workshop—with no experience—and it was a hit.



That spark grew into a passion. Now, Kerri shares her love for wildlife art and soft pastels, teaching others and embracing the simple, nature-inspired life that feeds her creativity.

Kerri believes that soft pastels are the best medium for wildlife

"The pastels create a really soft look and are very forgiving; they are beautiful to work with and a brilliant medium for beginners."

Living rurally, where even a milk run takes forty-five minutes, Kerri wanted to connect with other isolated women, both in Australia and overseas. That's when she launched *The Creative Barn Membership* online, nearly four years ago.

Now with over two hundred members worldwide, Kerri hosts regular Zoom sessions and has built a thriving, supportive art community.

"They come for the lessons, but stay for the connection," she says.

She also runs annual art retreats in the small Tasmanian town of Winnaleah, which sell out every year to members eager to meet in person, often for the first time.

The busy artist will be holding a student exhibition in November at the Maryborough Regional Art Society Gallery.

"The idea for the exhibition came about because some of my students are a little older and lack confidence. By having a student-only exhibition, it feels less intimidating. It builds their confidence so much, they come to the opening and are blown away seeing their work displayed alongside others, realising it looks just as good. The exhibition runs throughout the month, and I also include a slideshow of my international students' work.

"This year, I'm adding a virtual gallery tour for those who can't attend in person. I hold the exhibition every November at the Maryborough Art Society Gallery, and it's completely free for my students.

"It's so rewarding to see their faces on opening night. Some even sell their work during the show. It's a beautiful, community-building experience."

Kerri also has a solo exhibition coming up at Gatakers Artspace in Maryborough in April next year. Titled 'Colours of K'gari' (formerly Fraser Island), it highlights the rich reds and oranges of the island's iconic dingos and the Maheno Wreck, contrasted with the cooler tones of the landscape. "I'm fairly well known for drawing dingos," Kerri says. So, keep an eye

out for this striking showcase.

Last year, she was featured in the Artist's Spotlight at the Hervey Bay Regional Gallery, a proud moment for the artist. She's also in the Doyle Art Awards and recently sold a piece to Darcey Doyle's niece, which Kerri says was "pretty amazing."

What to pack for a whale watching trip

Whale watching offers an unforgettable chance to get up close and personal with our magnificent Humpbacks. With a little planning ahead, you'll make the most of your adventure, so come prepared and get ready for an amazing day out on the water!

Dress in layers - It can get quite cool out on the water, so wear a couple of layers so that you can take a layer off if needed.

Apply sunscreen - even when it's cloudy and cool, you can still be exposed to harmful UV rays and get sunburnt. So, pop on sunscreen. before heading out.

Consider taking along a waterproof jacket – you can sometimes get a little wet from the spray of the ocean water. You will want to keep yourself warm and dry.

Don't forget your sunglasses – On a sunny day, the sun hits the water and creates a strong glare, making it hard to see.



Take a hat – a hat will help protect you from the elements. Make sure the hat is secure, as you don't want it to blow away!

Wear sensible shoes – the deck of a boat can get slippery and wet. So, put away the stilettos and wear flat shoes, preferably with rubber soles.

A small waterproof backpack - A waterproof bag can help to keep your possessions dry when water from the ocean sprays on board the boat.

*Most whale-watching boats have a canteen on board that sells snacks, water, alcohol, and soft drinks.





IMAGINE IF YOU WILL



My values screamed clearer and louder

My faith became stronger

My beliefs became more powerful - now my husband's life depended on it.

As my husband fights 'incurable' cancer;

My strong beliefs are amplified:

To Be is more powerful than to do

Slow down the pace of life

Notice the details and be in nature

Be intentional yet calm and relaxed.

As my husband fights 'incurable' cancer;

The little things are the big things:

I find so much joy in....

Watching him sleep peacefully in his chair

Seeing him delight in the food he can actually taste

See his eyes light up when he helped someone with a few whispered words of wisdom.

As my husband fights 'incurable' cancer;

The meaningless things of life vanish

A powerful reminder of our vows (37 years ago) screams even louder "in sickness and in health" - not as a duty - but as a privilege.

I delight in his gratefulness in all the little tasks I and others do for him.

Holding him when he's unable to fall asleep on his own

As my husband fights 'incurable' cancer;

I'm reminded of those precious moments as a full time Mum of young children - I loved being available to nurture, pour out love, care and attention all day.

His depth of love and his connection to love has grown stronger every day

I love the contentment and twinkle I now see in his eyes We are not the same man, woman and couple we were just a few months ago.






